

Titanic – April 15, 1912



How many Lebanese on Titanic?

- Al-Huda newspaper on 20 April 1912 120-130 on board/31 survived
- NYT on 25 April 1912 154 on board
- Canadian newspaper on 27 April 1912 "over one hundred people from Mount Lebanon were on the boat and only a few were saved"
- Arabic newspapers and community greater than 165
- Ray Hanania (1998) 160 total/29 saved
- John G. Moses (2000) 174 Lebanese, 43 survivors
- Leila Salloum Elias (2011) 130 total/30 saved

Reasons for Confusion


- Names were anglicized
 - Hanna Tannus Mouawad = John Thomas
- Names of steerage passengers not on initial English lists reaching New York
- Lebanese names misspelled or modified
 - Mubarak Hanna Assi
- Lebanese immigrants classified as Syrians, Turkish, Ottoman, Assyrian

Numbers of Lebanese on Titanic

- Total passengers and crew on Titanic = 2200
- 1500 perished (832 passengers)
- 700 survived
- Best estimate of total Lebanese = 154
- 125 Lebanese were lost, 29 survived
- Lebanese = 10% of passengers and 15% of passengers who perished

Lebanon 1912

- 400 years of Ottoman rule: 1516 - 1919
- Religious persecution & oppression
- Commercial stagnation
- Mount Lebanon:
 economically
 impoverished, ill-suited
 for agriculture, high birth
 rate, no industry
- Diseases




Reasons for Immigration to Amrika

- Peak in 1912-1913:
 10,000 annually
- Ottoman oppression, economic stagnation, disease and hunger
- Better opportunities
- Success stories of returning immigrants
- American missionary activity





Why so many Lebanese on Titanic?




- Building of Titanic in Belfast, Ireland
 - White Star Line
- News about Titanic reached the Lebanese
- Part of second wave of Mt. Lebanon emigrants

Journey of Lebanese on Titanic

- Down the mountain to Beirut
- Port of Beirut to board a French liner making stops in Mediterranean
- Marseille -Train to Paris to Cherbourg on "Train Transatlantique"
- Titanic picked up passengers from Cherbourg on evening of April 10, 1912
- Sets sail to Queenstown Ireland





Lebanese on the Titanic






- All were in Third Class or Steerage
- Second Class: Nqoula and Adele Nasrallah
- Only 65 had country of origin listed
- Destinations: Ontario,
 Canada and Northeastern
 states of New York,
 Pennsylvania, Ohio and
 Connecticut

- "Meen il Raiyis"?
- Accommodations
- Weddings (4)
- Sailing conditions





What happened to the Lebanese on that fateful night?

- 11:40pm Titanic hits iceberg
- 12am Ship is "unsalvageable"
- 12:20am Evacuation begins
- Women & children to the front, men to the rear
- Steerage passengers
 - Told "there was no danger"
 - Instructions in English
 - Remained below deck not knowing what happened
 - Shots fired
 - Iron gates and blocked doors



Titanic – The Last Minutes









Lebanese Survivors & Victims

- Titanic sank at 2:20am on April 15, 1912
- Lebanese survivors = 29
 Men 4
 Women 20
 Children 5
- Lebanese who perished = 125
- 25% of Lebanese passengers saved vs. 31% of Titanic passengers

Carpathia to the Rescue







Carpathia sails to New York

- Survivors traumatized, freezing and ill
- Taken to 3 NYC hospitals
- Lebanese newspapers
- Lebanese community rallied
- Funds by White Star Line and International Relief





Halifax

- First responder city –
 700 miles from disaster
- Biggest North American port with famed cable ships
- MacKay Bennett 306 bodies
- Minia 17 bodies
- Church services &
 burials May 3 June 12









Story of Daher Abi Chedid (22 years old)

- In love with a girl from same village.
- Escapes arrest by Ottomans
- Takes boat in port of Selaata-Cyprus-Cherbourg-Titanic
- Froze to death during Titanic sinking

Nakad basement – tragedy occurs



Ebrine - Daher Abi Chedid

- Body recovered by the Mackay Bennett
- Sent to Halifax,
 Nova Scotia first
- Laid to rest on May 4th 1912 in Mount Carmel, PA

NO. 9. - MALE. - ESTIMATED AGE, 22. - SCAR UNDER RIGHT SIDE OF CHIN HAIR, DARK.

CLOTHING - Grey mixture suit; handkerchief with blue border.

NO MARKS

EFFECTS - Moustache brush; pocket mirror and pencil; purse with French, Turkish, and Austrian money.

THIRD CLASS: PROBABLY S. FRENCH OR ITALIAN.


NAME - NAHIL SCHEDID (on health certif.)

Hardin

- Caza of Batroun –
 mountainous region famous
 for St. Hardini
- 19 people from Hardin on Titanic - only 7 survived

Story of Sileneh Dagher (Age 16) and Antoun Yasbeck


- Antoun was forced off lifeboat
- Sileneh remarried, had 9 children
- Told story of what Hardin men did
- Died at age 69 in Norfolk, Virginia



Hardin

Story of Moubarak Assi (24 years old)

- Farm worker, strong, known for his beautiful voice
- Deacon of Patriach Elias Howayek
- Story he told about Hardin men
- "Dabke Ya Chabeb"
- Business in Michigan



Hardin Zajal

Cry and weep, Hardin for your men who drowned

You lost 11 young men, aged 25

7 of them are single, the rest are married

None of them have gray hair, all were 25

Story of survivor Zad Assaf (Mariana Assaf) – 45yo

- On Titanic to go back to her husband in Ontario
- Interview by Ottawa Citizen -April 24th 1912
 - Elias Tannous Nasrallah
 - Pushed into one of last lifeboat
- Admitted to hospital for observation
- Joined her husband in Ontario





Zahleh - Bekaa



Zahleh

Story of Nqoula Nasrallah (28) and his wife Adele Hakim (14)


- Second class passengers
- Nqoula got Adele on lifeboat No.14
- Helped kids get onto lifeboats
- His body #43 found by MacKay-Bennett
- Laid to rest in Mt. Olivet
 Cemetery in Maspeth, NY

Story of Emir Fares Chehab (20 years old)

- Going to NY to study his passion: music
- Helped his Lebanese countrymen by translating instructions
- Playing his Oud until the very end
- A true hero!

Tebnine

Story of Fatima Mousselmani (22 years old)

- Traveled with two cousins
- To Michigan City, Indiana
- Saved a 4 year-old child
- Lost her cousins
- Moved to Dearborn, MI
- Married and divorced
- Died at age 81






Thoum - Batroun

Story of Shaanineh Abi Saab (38 years old)

- Lived in Fghal
- Married with five children
- Left in 1906 with her 2 youngest – Youngstown, Ohio
- Hard-working: Peddled goods
- Husband became depressed and died of asthma in 1907
- 17 yo son developed pneumonia in Lebanon



Shaanineh Abi Saab on Titanic

- Boarded with 4 of her cousins: Hanna Tannous, his son, Gerios Youssef and Tannous Daher
- Banoura Ayoub (14yo) from Kfaraabida
- Cousin Gerios pushed her and Banoura into Collapsible C




"We watched the lights of the big boat with our hearts in our throats. Then we saw it sink" – Sharon Herald, April 14, 1937





View of Beirut at Time




Gerios Youssef on Titanic

- Traveled to Cherbourg with 4 relatives
- Saved his cousin Shaanineh and young girl Banoura
- Refused to disguise and get on the lifeboat

"I would rather die with my countrymen...I am no different from anyone else"


Body #312 found by Minia on April 26, 1912


Buried in Mount Olivet Cemetery in Halifax on May 10th, 1912

Youssif Gerios

Originally from Lebanon, Gerios Youssef (as his name should appear) was immigrating to the United States to work in the steel mills in Ohio. He boarded the *Titanic* in Cherbourg, France. He was travelling with four cousins, two of whom were women. Both women survived.
